1. Familiarize yourself with Palestine. What is typically presented by U.S. corporate media is Israel's version of history and current events. Go beyond that.

2. Become familiar with the **BDS Movement**

3. Contact your federal politicians (President, Senators, Representative) every day, if you can, by email and/or phone. Their contact information is on their web sites. Once you fill out their email form, it's saved, so repeated contacts are easy. The people of Palestine are being brutalized every day and our politicians need to be reminded that our tax dollars (\$4 billion/year and billions more in weapons) are the major funding source for the death and destruction.

I'd be able to hear my amphibian friends' primordial call: _

We are one, we are one, we are one Perhaps if I could recall the rapid thrum of the nine hummingbirds beating wings, whipping in and out around the feeder, with a thrummm, thrummm, thrummm on that cold Montana morning in May, I'd remember that my heartbeat synched with metronomic ease.

to their tiny thrumming selves and rhythmic reminder: We are one, we are one, we are one Perhaps if I could be real still

and lay my body on the syrupy mud

along the creek behind the wood

and hear the ferns unfurling in unison

and the roots of the poplar stretching toward the spring,
